

Parish Council Elections – 2nd May 2019

If you are interested in standing for election, you should contact your Town
Clerk as soon as possible. Contact details are

To stand for election at a Parish Council you must:

- Be at least 18 years old
- Be a British citizen or an eligible Commonwealth citizen
- Meet at least one of the following four qualifications:

- (a) on those days and thereafter be a local government elector for the Parish; or
- (b) for the whole of the 12 months preceding both nomination day and the day of election, have occupied as owner or tenant any land or other premises in the Parish;
- (c) have your principal or only place of work during the 12 months preceding both nomination day and the day of election in the Parish; or
- (d) during the whole of the 12 months preceding both nomination day and the day of election, lived either in the parish or within 4.8 kilometres of it

Recipe

Lorraines Vegan Beetroot chocolate fudgecake

Available all year round, Beetroot is not only for pickling this recipe is super moist and extra rich. This cake goes perfectly with a cup of tea and it is so chocolatey you won't even realise there is beetroot in it!

Serves 8

Preparation time 25 minutes

Cooking time 35 minutes

250g/9oz plain flour

300g/10oz light brown sugar

85g/3oz cocoa powder

2 tsp baking powder

1 tsp bicarbonate of soda

125ml/4.5 fl oz vegetable oil

2 tsp vanilla extract

200g/7oz grated beetroot

300ml/10.5 fl oz almond milk

375g 13 oz icing sugar

1.5 tbsp. cocoa powder

75g/2.5 oz dairy free butter

4.5 tbsp boiling water



Method

Preheat oven to 180c /350 f /gas 4

Grease 2x 20 cm (8 in) loose bottomed cake tins with dairy free butter and line the bottoms. In a large bowl sieve together plain flour, sugar, cocoa, baking powder and bicarbonate of soda. Add almond milk vanilla extract, vet oil and mix well until all is well combined.

Divide the mixture into 2 tins. Cook for 25-30 mins until a skewer inserted comes out clean. Then remove from tins use a rounded palette knife to ensure cakes come out easily leave to cool completely.

Icing

In a bowl melt 75g/2.5 oz dairy free butter with the boiling water. In a sperate bowl mix together the icing sugar with 1.5 tbsp sieved cocoa powder. Add the melted butter to the sugar mixture and blend well until you have a smooth icing. The icing will harden a little once cooled.

Spread half the icing on top of on half of the cake and sandwich together and ice the top of the stacked cake. To finish decorate with nuts, sprinkles etc.

Gardeners Page

Companion planting

In this edition we offer tips for companion planting. This is the art of understanding which plants happily grow and thrive together in the same plot of earth. Planting together will also save space in a small garden.

In the spring, it is ideal to plant your beetroot under your cabbage. This will give shade to the beetroot and protect it in any hot weather. Also, when watering the cabbage, the beetroot is watered at the same time and moisture will be retained in the ground.

Another idea for companion planting is to plant Calendula liberally between potatoes to prevent eel worm. French Marigolds are also an alternative but aren't quite as strong a deterrent!

The Spring Garden

Start sowing spinach outdoors in soil enriched with plenty of organic matter. Sow spring onion seeds in drills outdoors for a quick crop to add to salads and stir fries. Try Swiss chard sown outdoors for a colourful crop - they even look great in flower beds! For early turnips sow the seed directly into the ground. Start to plant potatoes, broad beans, peas.

Plant now

Deciduous trees and shrubs can be planted until the end of the month. Newly planted trees and shrubs should be top dressed with compost or manure. If you are able to use your own home-made compost then do so.

Harvest now

Beetroot (early summer), turnips, swede, Brussel sprouts, winter cabbage.

Leafy greens. Fall-planted leafy greens such as kale and collard greens are not only tough enough to survive the cold – and even snow – they usually taste all the better for it.

Alliums, garlic, peas and broad beans. Broccoli and cauliflower. Cabbage and Root vegetables.

Top tips

As the weather begins to get a little milder sow new lawn area, but make sure you protect them from the birds.

The Allotments Association will be holding an open day with BBQ on Monday 23rd April. Open to all. There will be talks, practical demonstrations and recycling tips. There will also be produce available to purchase.

Update from Spilsby Town Council

Spilsby Town council are working in partnership with the local community, voluntary agencies and statutory and public bodies to improve the quality, life and wellbeing of residents and businesses in an active and positive manner. We aim to make provision to ensure sufficient resources are made available to carry this out and to promote the town.

We are working to attract more visitors, to provide a sense of community, and to make the council open and accessible to all. Ultimately we are planning for a better future and stronger economy for the people and businesses in Spilsby.

East Lindsey District Council have taken onboard our plans and will be working with the Town Council to provide as much help as they can. We will work together to maintain the physical structure of the town. Plans are already in hand to rebuild the church wall and address the issues of empty properties and shops. Going forward we will also be working to improve parking in the town.

We are working together with the newly formed allotments association to Improve Spilsby allotments. Allotment plots have been sized, the roads have been improved and going forward it will become a more usable space for the community.

The council's administrative efficiency and procedures have been reviewed to ensure they are relevant and achieve results. The administration capacity has been improved and more hours are now given to administrative duties. We are in the process of reviewing policies to improve the council conduct and ensure these are enforced. With local elections just around the corner we will be working to keep a full body of Councillors and to ensure that the Clerks have the appropriate training to complete the role of the Council.

The visibility and accessibility of the Councillors and Clerks will be improved. We will have more notice boards and an improved web presence. This newsletter will also raise our profile. Businesses in the town will also be co-opted on to Council Sub Committees to give their valuable input e.g newsletter, Christmas preparations etc. We will also be looking into what the Business Partnership need from the council to help the business to thrive.

Look out for the work we are undertaking with Youth engagement. We will be conducting a Survey of 13-18 years to find out what they want from their leisure time in Spilsby We will be working to improve sports facilities also. This will include looking into the viability of a Skate park, establishing a cricket club and a non church youth club.

We have been working with the market organiser at ELDC to improve stall holder numbers and have discussed holding a periodic Farmers' Market. We will look into the sponsorship of more stalls and also look into the availability of a plan to invest in any business opportunities which would bring more visitors into the town. This includes working to improve tourism with lovelincolnshirewolds.com.

Where does the money come from to do all this?

- Council Tax income (Precept)

For most councils this will be by far the largest part of its income. “Precept” is simply a word for a demand for money which must be met. For local councils, this is collected by the district council via the general council tax bill, from all the council tax payers in the district.

- Cemetery fees
- Interest from bank accounts and other investments

In December the Council will budget for the following years expenditure starting in April.

Our precept for the year 2019-2020 will be £86,885.

The amount per household is calculated by how many households there are in the parish paying council tax. This will cause a rise in council tax of 80p per week for a band D property. Most properties are band A or B within the town so the increase will be less for most households.

The increase is due to the initiatives which the council are undertaking and also committed expenditure due to changes in District and County Council responsibilities.

Below are the main extra expenditures for the coming year:-

- Tourism/promotion £3000 plus events and signage.
- £20,000 for Church Wall (responsibility of the council since it's collapse).
- £12,000 for further upgrade to play area.
- £1,500 new tap for cemetery.
- £7,000 for improved Christmas Lights
- £1,000 Picnic in the park
- £15,000 Grass cutting. (partly due to a reduction in grass cutting by LCC)
- Provision for training for new Councillors due to local elections.

We will make ongoing regular reviews of all strategic themes to ensure they are on track and still relevant within the Town's Community Plan.

Over two evenings in early March, something cool, exciting and a little bit different will be happening in Spilsby as the Town Centre is transformed into a playground of light, projection, artwork and colour and some of the Town's best-known buildings and landmarks are lit up!

The Spilsby Light Night is a new project being run by the Different Light Collective and is being funded primarily by Arts Council England. Simon Hollingworth and Andy Johnson-Smith came up with the idea last summer and following on from discussions with Bruce Knight at the Spilsby Sessions House they have been chatting to businesses, organisations schools, churches and individuals across the town since they received news of their successful award just before Christmas.

On each of the two nights there will be a trail with lighting, projections and sound effects made by professional artists and technologists on view at venues and buildings across the centre of the town as well as artwork by local groups, including children and students from the town's schools. There will also be a chance for anyone to get involved in a community project using decorated glass jars of all shapes & sizes with tea lights inside them which will be collected and shown around the Buttercross on the Market Place and outside St James' Church.

Creative Producer Simon Hollingworth said "The Different Light Collective is delighted to have been given this opportunity to create something really special in Spilsby and we are really excited about working with as many local people as possible to make it as successful as possible. The response we have had so far, from schools, businesses, churches and members of the general public has been overwhelmingly positive and we feel very privileged to be working here. We can't wait for the chance to show off Spilsby in a different light!"



Community Led Housing


Community Led housing is about local people playing a leading and lasting role in solving housing problems, creating genuinely affordable homes and strong communities in ways that are difficult to achieve through mainstream housing.

It is a broad movement encompassing a range of approaches, including Community Land Trusts (CLTs), cooperatives, cohousing, self-help housing and group self-build, and can involve new build, regeneration or the use of existing buildings.

Community-led housing is providing hope to people in housing need.

Spilsby Town Council are working in partnership with East Lindsey District Council in the hope to build new houses for local people at affordable rent. It will be working with a local housing association who will maintain the properties and collect the rent. The Town Council will take a small share of the profit to be used within the community to provide facilities.
