Sweetcorn fritters



Ingredients

300g sweetcorn
3 spring onions very finely chopped
3 eggs
30ml milk
75g plain flour
½ tsp cayenne pepper
Vegetable oil for frying
Salt and freshly ground black pepper

Method

1. To make the fritters, put the sweetcorn and spring onions in a bowl. Beat the eggs with the milk. Pour this mixture over the sweetcorn and mix well. Season with salt and pepper. Sieve the flour with the cayenne pepper and then stir into the sweetcorn mixture.

2. Add the oil to a large frying pan – you need to shallow fry these, so make sure the base of the pan is well covered. Heat the oil then test by adding a tiny bit of the batter – it should immediately start bubbling around the edges when it hits the oil. Using a small ladle, drop batter onto the oil – you need around 2 tbsp of mixture per fritter. You should be able to fry 4–5 at any one time. Fry for a couple of minutes on one side until light brown then turn over and cook for a further minute.

3. Turn out onto kitchen paper to remove any excess oil and keep warm in a low oven. Continue until you have used all the batter.

Gardening tips for Summer

July and August in the garden can be challenging for both gardeners and their plants. Here are some tips to keep your gardens healthy in the heat of August.

Pull weeds as soon as you notice them, before they go to seed in the garden. This will help reduce overwintering weeds that can wreak havoc next year. Remove spent flowers (deadhead) on annuals, roses and perennials. Many will reward you with more blooms that continue well into fall. Prune and remove dead branches on shrubs and small trees. Keep new plantings of flowers, shrubs and trees watered during hot, dry spells. Apply a fresh layer of mulch (1 to 2 inches thick) after you weed. This will help the soil maintain moisture and reduce future weed crops.

Start seeds for fall crops including spinach, lettuce and greens. Many of these will grow well into winter and tolerate light frost. Harvest Sweetcorn and other summer vegetables as they become ready. Select candidates for drying including hydrangea blossoms and ornamental grasses. Harvest them when they are dry in the morning but before noon when temperatures become to hot. With annual flowers, select those that are not fully open. Once you cut the stems, strip all the leaves and remove any damaged parts of the flower. Store them in a dry, dark, warm place, preferably one with good air circulation. Depending on the type of flower, it may take two to three weeks before they are completely dry.

SPILSBY ALLOTMENTS

Spilsby Town Council and their Allotments Association have recently improved the allotments on Hundleby Road with help from the National Lottery Awards for All.

Spilsby Christian Fellowship

Spilsby Christian Fellowship has been active in the town since the 1903's and whilst its original aim remains to promote the Christian faith with weekly Sunday Services, it is committed to serving the local community – relieving sickness and financial hardship whilst promoting and preserving good health and offering educational support. To this end SCF has been involved in a number of community events throughout the years. A youth group has been run on the premises since around the early 1990's, and regular coffee mornings provided an important social meeting place, for a good number of years.

Since we got involved in the church, we have been actively involved in various family/community events. In 2007 we opened "Come and Play" our weekly parent and toddler- which expanded to 2 sessions a week, and continues today on a Monday and Tuesday with a baby session each Wednesday, and Gingerbread – our single parent support group on a Thursday. Due to kind sponsorship from Aldi & Greggs in June we launched "Tasty Tuesdays" offering a drop-in buffet breakfast before play at our toddler group. From time to time we offer training courses (often with crèche facility) covering 1st Aid, Food & Hygiene, parenting courses, and family social events and fun days.

In 2008 we relaunched the youth group, which meets each Friday split into two sessions for the primaries 4-10's and the 10-17 yr olds. This group provides a safe meeting place, whilst encouraging and supporting the young through a structured programme of team building activities, promotion of valuable life skills such as first aid, food and nutrition, crafts, money management, stress management and coping skills etc which are often unable to be met by the school curriculum. Due to the consistency of volunteer staff we are able to build good relationships with the young people and their families, and provide supporting networks, advice, encouragement and guidance should it be needed.

The church has always provided practical, financial and spiritual support to local families, quietly, discreetly and confidentially assisting where necessary as we feel God intends. In 2016 SCF became a drop-off point for "Baby's Basket" a Lincoln based charity providing baby's baskets and newborn clothing to families in need.

Our small food bank – supported by Aldi, Greggs and local donations is not "means" tested and can be accessed by anyone in need, as can our School Uniform Bank. This new initiative was launched in Aug 2018 in response to the financial implications of purchasing new uniform, and to encourage people to be more environmentally aware. The scheme urges families to donate outgrown, good condition uniform to the bank, where they will be made available to those who need them. We work with a number of local schools, children's centre/social services to promote the scheme and there is a collection bin in Nationwide Uniforms on the industrial estate.

In January 2019 we launched our monthly Intergenerational Club, financed through a grant from #iwill encouraging older members 60+ of the community to join young people in games, crafts and puzzles. This has become a popular addition to our services.

All of our events, activities and groups are open to anyone, and take place either in our church hall or community rooms (portacabin, directly behind the church) and we would love to invite you to come along and meet us. 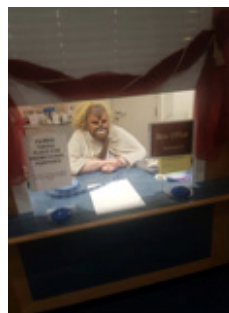

Spilsby Community Cinema

Friday 5th January 2018 was the date when Spilsby Community Cinema held its first screening at Franklin Hall with over 60 in the audience to watch Viceroy's House. The group who put it together consisted of Bonny Smith, Elaine & Mick Lowe, Steph Round, Marie Cheetham, Terry Taylor, Rod Williams and Lee Marsh. We wanted to have a Hollywood feel to the occasion and the ladies dressed up in evening gowns and the gentlemen in tuxedos. Since then we've had a number of additional people help, both Bonny and Steph's husbands and my wife and daughter. In the last 14 months it has gone from strength to strength with audience figures reaching over 120 on a number of occasions.

During these the early screenings Bonny started to select a fancy-dress costume that related to the film being screened. And she has taken people's money at the box office dressed as Freddie Mercury, Edna Moe, a rabbit and Chewbacca to name just a few. Some of the audience say that there is as much entertainment with her fancy dress as the film!



The initial few screenings were kindly supported by the Town Council, Lincs. Rural Housing and an anonymous benefactor, but March 2018 we were lucky enough to receive National Lottery Funding to pay for the hiring of the equipment and the hall. This took an enormous amount of pressure off the group to source more funding to continue the monthly screenings as audience members were increasing with each month.



The cinema, is part of a community of pop up cinemas in Lincolnshire that work with Flix In The Stix based in Lincoln to offer the cinema experience in town and village halls and although it isn't able to show the latest films but as soon as they are available on Blue Ray DVD, Flix In The Stix communicate a selection of films for the group to choose from. However, we are looking at the possibility of allowing the public to help choose the preferred films.

We tried offering afternoon screenings during the school holidays, having Father Christmas hand out selection boxes after our December screening of Nativity and we've also been the location of Pirate Gold for BBC Radio Lincolnshire's treasure hunt which is held every Sunday morning.

We have had our trials and tribulations over the time we have been showing the films. Such as, with inconsistent audience figures, technical issues with the equipment and knowing what films will appeal to the community of Spilsby. But we persevered and approached each month with a new found vigour, welcoming any feedback about what we were delivering as "all feedback is a free gift"! And now we are presenting a quality experience for the community which we hope anyone who attends enjoys.

If you haven't been yet then please give it a try, we normally show films on the first Friday of the month (unless Franklin Hall has a previous booking). Doors open at 6.15pm and the film starts at 7.00pm. Tickets are £4, we have refreshments available including ice cream.
