A couple of district council initiatives to encourage residents and visitors back into the Town centre are proving successful and our businesses have responded well. I have recently had the pleasure of cutting the ribbon to open, or re-open, five shops and our Monday Market goes from strength to strength with many new traders now attending. I visit the Market most Mondays on behalf of the council to encourage and discuss any issues traders may have. Community Speed Watch

COMMUNITY SPEED WATCH

In 2019 Spilsby Town Council decided to form a local Community Speed Watch team.

There were a number of volunteers, who all received training from the County Council Road Safety team. We met on a regular basis and noted that people were beginning to watch their speed as they drove around and through Spilsby.

All drivers who exceeded the speed limit were reported to the Road Safety Alliance, who followed this up with the Police.

Sadly, lockdown hit us and we were unable to meet. As we all know, there were a series of lockdowns. These have affected the team and our volunteer numbers are falling.

If you would like to join us, training is undertaken by Zoom. We really need your support for us to be effective again. Practical training is undertaken by experienced team members.

No, we are not doing the job of the Police Force. We are dedicated volunteers who want to make the roads safer for all of our community.

COLLAPSED WALL AT ST JAMES CHURCH. SPILSBY

Why is the Council responsible?

At a recent meeting, Spilsby Town Councillors agreed that it is necessary to communicate with residents about the reconstruction of the wall at St James Church, as this is a large expenditure for the Council and the Town. The Council is responsible for the reconstruction of the wall because the churchyard is 'closed'. A "closed churchyard" means that a churchyard has been closed for burials by an Order under the Burial Acts. This is detailed in section 18 of the Burial Act 1855, which is what led to the transfer of responsibility for closed churchyards to local authorities.

When a churchyard becomes closed, the responsibility for the maintenance of the churchyard transfers to the local authority, in this case, Spilsby Town Council.

Reconstruction Process

Because the wall belongs to the church, progression for commencing reconstruction work is not straightforward. An application must be approved by the diocese before work can commence. A construction design also must be approved. Specialist surveyors, structural designers and Health and Safety managers must be appointed. Then tenders are invited from approved contractors. Because the wall collapsed onto the grounds of two residential properties, work to move sheds belonging to these properties and provision of a safe working area had to be completed.

Where are we now?

Most of the provisional processes are now in place and surveyors are awaiting the submission



Costs so far.

Cost of works carried out so far: £19,771

Cost of committed expenditure: £5,371 (not including the rebuild)

Surveyors estimate of the potential cost of

completion.

The Council has chosen a quotation through the tendering process. The cost of the reconstruction will be £123,631.50

How do these costs affect the Council's finances?

Over the last few years, the Council has gradually built up reserves through the Precept. The Council currently has in the region of £120,000 in reserves. The Council has had to raise the Precept to meet the cost of the work. The decision to raise the Precept was not taken lightly by the Council. The Precept increase is reflected in the increase in Council Tax bills recently.

It is likely that a Public Works loan will be needed in the short term. This will avert a further steep increase in the Precept to pay for the reconstruction.

Why was the cost not covered through Insurance?

The Church wall was not covered by insurance prior to the collapse of the wall.

An internal investigation has been carried out to try to see why this was the case. The information from this investigation will be reported back to Council. Residents will be kept informed of the findings in due course.

The investigation will help the Council to learn from this incident. This will help to ensure that a similar occurrence will never happen again.

The wall is now insured against further damage.

This statement has been considered and has the approval of the whole of the Town Council.

Priorities for this quarter:

Fatal 4: Throughout the whole country, speeding is a real issue for all communities. Lincolnshire Police understand this is a priority for most people, and so we will continue to carry out 'fatal four' days of action, tackling issues around speeding, using a mobile phone whilst driving, not wearing a seatbelt and being unfit to drive due to drink or drugs. We will continue to enforce the above offences by regular patrols and speed checks in hot spot locations.

DRUGS: We have listened to concerns from our local community and we have decided to set drugs as one of our priorities for this quarter. We will be working with an appropriate agency to tackle this issue. Action days will be held within our community. We will be visiting local schools and local youth clubs to deliver education in relation around drugs issues. We will also work closely with our community to assist us with developing intelligence which will help us with the enforcement.

LOCAL PRIORITY

Every three months, we listen to your concerns and look at recent crime statistics to shape the things we will concentrate on for the next three months. Our priority(s) for the next quarter:

FORTHCOMING ENGAGEMENTS

Up and coming engagements will be announced via Next Door, where members of the public will have the opportunity to meet members of your local NPT.

ASB continues to blight the community in certain areas. We aim to focus on these areas and will be proactive and robust in our approach to tackling this kind of unacceptable behaviour. Therefore we have decided to set ASB as a priority for the next quarter. We take ASB very seriously and we will act on any report appropriately. We will be holding nights of action with a multiagency approach working with the ELDC ASB officer, the Special Constabulary, VPCSO and the Speed Reduction team.

We have now issued since 16/03/2021 12 UBWL (Unacceptable Behaviour Warning Letters) to Local People that have been consistently causing problems around Spilsby. Three of these are the stage two and a stage two pending for a local adult female.

Three of the same youths have also been arrested for allegations of a criminal offence which we are dealing

After a stage two UBWL we will be pursuing ASB contracts which will include local agreements with the Police such as curfews and other requirements that persistent offenders must adhere to.

Along with Spilsby Town Council we have also had a meeting and site visit with representatives of LCC regarding problems of ASB at the town centre bus shelter and what we can do with it to help stop ASB from happening around it.

All incidents of ASB must be reported to the Police and are being dealt with robustly through the ASB process as they come to our attention.

SPEEDING: Four tickets for speeding were given out in Sibsey and we will continue to do random patrols in the Spilsby beat code area.

BUSY SUMMER MONTHS FOR LIVES RESPONDERS

LIVES lifesaving First Responders have been out in Lincolnshire communities responding to 999 medical emergencies, as well as spending hours each month training and perfecting their skills. The summer months often increase the number of jobs they are called to. From sporting injuries to cardiac arrests, road traffic collisions to breathing difficulties.

The volunteers, who respond in districts across the county, have now been able to return to face-to-face training as lockdown restriction ease. As well as keeping up to date on important skills, face-to-face training serves as a way of support, and it is something that the Responders missed through lockdown.

As part of LIVES' vision to make Lincolnshire the safest place to have a 999 medical emergency, the charity has been able to start going out to events and schools to teach people the importance of bystander CPR. Cardiac arrest can strike at any time and even in people who appear to be young and healthy. In fact, every week in the UK, 12 people under the age of 35 suffer from Young, Sudden Cardiac Death (YSCD). This has recently been brought in focus with the incident with footballer, Christian Eriksen.

Figures have shown that the number of people surviving out of hospital cardiac arrest has more than doubled in the last 10 years. This has been attributed to more people learning how to deliver effective CPR, as well as community defibrillators becoming more commonplace. LIVES First Responders are supplied with a kit bag and defibrillator, and are based right across the county, so if the worst happened, they could get to the incident, fast.

LIVES Responder Pippa Crust explains why she chooses to volunteer: "When I was just 15, my brother collapsed from a cardiac arrest. No-one suspected it could happen to such a young, healthy person, so no-one started CPR. It made me determined to never be in that position again, and LIVES have supported me in my training."

To keep LIVES First Responders trained, equipped and confident to be out on the road, we need to raise over £1 million every year. Last year, a series of virtual events were launched, the most recent being LIVES 51 Miles in May. The team did exceptionally, despite the unseasonably wet weather! In total, our 26 entrants managed 717 miles and raised over £1300! Every penny raised will be spent supporting the army of volunteers.



This September you can join a new cycling challenge, Lands' End to John O'Groats! If you do not want to cover the 874 miles on your own, you can join as a team and share the miles between you. The great news - you don't need to leave the county, unless you want to of course. You can instead take to the open roads of the beautiful Lincolnshire countryside, or do it from the comfort of your dining room on your exercise bike, it is entirely up to you.

If cycling isn't your thing and you have always dreamed of running the iconic London Marathon, this is the challenge for you! You can decide if you want to do the entire distance in one go, or over a week, and you can either run it or walk it. As you record your activities on Strava, you will be moved around the actual route of the London Marathon via google maps. As good as being there in person.

For a while the PCC has been discussing the need to restore the clock face to its former glory but since then

the mechanism became problematic and has now stopped altogether. But it's not as simple as putting a new battery in and a bit of paint.

Did you know that someone went up the tower steps to wind the clock twice a week?

The work involves putting up scaffolding before any work can commence – that's the first cost. The next step is to remove the dial motion works and clock hands – that's the second cost. Finally, is the restoration of the clock face. All this will cost in excess of £8000.

Do you miss the Church clock chiming and if you do would you like to help get it repaired?

Fundraising for this is going to be difficult so we are appealing to the townsfolk and those who visit the town for shopping, socialising etc. for donations.


