

## HOW IS THE TOWN'S FIRE STATION AND CREW PERFORMING?

Following the hot and busy July, the crew didn't have much of a let up in August either with 39 calls in that month, with four on the same day at times! Because of the critical situation with availability of appliances during this time, the Spilsby crew spent some time in August dealing with incidents in the Lincoln and Gainsborough area too.

Don't forget the Crew will be escorting Santa around the town near to Christmas, so please check out their social media account for further dates and times

## So how many incidents has the crew attended between 28th July 2022 and 20th October 2022?

They responded to the following number of call outs:

28th - 31st July - 3 calls August - 39 calls

September - 13 calls up to 20th October - 5 calls

With the cost of living increasing furthermore, you may be tempted to re-instate your open fires and use other means to light your property, such as, candles or oil lamps. If you are tempted in doing this, then please ensure that you have had your chimney swept. This should be done annually even if you have always used an open fire and please ensure that you have working smoke and carbon monoxide alarms!

As we approach Christmas, please make sure that your Christmas lights are working correctly and that there is no damage to the cables or plugs. Please use an RCD for any external lighting. Or better still, use solar powered lights.

Smoker, Hoarder, Elderly, Reduced mobility, Mental health issues, Alcohol or drug dependant or needing care or support.



## **Patient Participation Group AGM**

Thank you to the practice's PPG for inviting us to their well-attended AGM in October – the first held face to face since the pandemic began. Dr Savory, Dr Howarth and Practice Manager, Jason Longstaff, welcomed the opportunity to update our community about staffing, premises, how we work, and the daily pressures of NHS primary care. We enjoyed the well-informed Q&A, and thank those of you in attendance for your continued support for our team.

#### Premises update

In July 2021, NHS Lincolnshire CCG approved Spilsby Surgery's business case for a new health centre off Halton Road. Since then, pieces of the bigger planning and legal jigsaw have been slow to fit into place. Our new build will sit within a new housing development. East Lindsey District Council agreed outline planning permission for this in May 2022. At our copy deadline in late October, we await confirmation that legal processes have been concluded; the prerequisite for the development of the whole site and our new Surgery.



Meanwhile our increasing number of patients and clinicians need more space to maximize face-to-face appointments through a difficult winter and the coming year. By the time you read this, we hope our landlords will have given permission for us to site two Portakabin consulting rooms on the staff car park. Without this, doctors will end up working remotely from home, training places will be cancelled, and patients directed to attend Urgent Treatment Centres at Skegness, Louth and Boston when we reach capacity. #### **Evening and weekend appointments**

Pre-booked appointments outside 'core' hours are organised by the SOLAS Primary Care Network and run by Lincolnshire Area Doctors Medical Service (LADMS). They currently offer weekday evening telephone appointments, and Saturday daytime telephone and face-to-face appointments at Spilsby Surgery. Requests for care are triaged by a duty clinician before a booking is made.

#### **Vaccinations**

Thank you to the 1200 patients who attended our successful flu vaccination clinic at the Franklin Hall on Saturday 22 October. Thanks too to our staff who gave up their weekend. If you are over 50, or in an at-risk group, and haven't yet had your annual flu vaccination, its not too late. Spilsby Surgery still has a number of vaccinations available: please contact our Care Navigators on 01790 728111 (option 1) to book. When our supply has gone, you will be able to book a flu jab at a community pharmacy, but please get protected sooner rather than later.

Covid vaccinations are organised by NHS Lincolnshire Integrated Care Board. If you are eligible for an autumn booster but haven't yet had one, please call 119 or visit www.nhs.uk to book and keep one eye on our facebook page and website for updates.

## LIVES.

What a year it's been so far, the months have flown by, the heat of summer seems like a distant memory and now the nights have drawn in there's a definite chill in the air, and the trees are losing their leaves, Autumn is officially here!

Throughout the year we have supported numerous Fundraisers and Responders to raise money for LIVES, from taking to the skies for our very first Wing Walk, walking the Humber Bridge, to running the iconic London Marathon for Team LIVES, which the lovely Charlotte did in September:

Dad was always a keen runner and I now realise from my training he was pretty good too. As a child I always wanted to do what Dad was doing, I used to try running with him and when I couldn't keep up, I would hop on my bike and follow him round. One of his life ambitions was to run the London Marathon. You had to be 18 to run so I convinced him to wait until I was old enough so we could do it together. Unfortunately, my dad passed away when I was 16 as the result of a car accident. I ran to raise money for LIVES because it was LIVES responders who were there with him after his accident, and I am grateful for everything that they did for him that day to try and save him.

In Spring we were invited to take part in Biker Breakfast, which was hosted by the Road Safety Partnership. 
