SPILSBY TOWN COUNCIL PRECEPT 2023/24

Spilsby Town Council's income (Precept) is collected by East Lindsey District Council from all Council Tax payers in the district.

The amount per household is calculated by how many households there are in the parish paying Council Tax.

The Town Council also receive income from Cemetery Fees, Allotment Fees and Interest from bank accounts.

The Precept for 2023/24 will increase by 12.5%, this is due to the current rate of inflation (10%), the initiatives which the Council are undertaking and also committed expenditure for the coming year.

Local councils fund numerous services, depending on the size of the council. Many you will see day to day, but some are less known. For Spilsby Town Council these include:

- Managing and maintaining allotments and open spaces (Spinney & Toc H wildlife areas)
- Managing and maintaining the Play Area on Boston Road recreation ground
- Managing and maintaining the Cemetery, war memorials and closed churchyard
- Floral displays around the town
- Public seating and litter bins
- Creating neighbourhood plans
- Emergency Planning
- Managing and maintaining CCTV
- Remembrance Parade
- Mayoral Engagements
- Grants for local groups

BECOMING A LOCAL COUNCILLOR

As a local councillor you can become a voice for your community and make a real change. Local councillors are the champions of their community who invest time in local projects and issues to the benefit of residents and the neighbourhood.

Local councillor responsibilities fall into three main categories:

- Decision making
- Monitoring
- Getting involved locally

Local councillors attend to local needs of residents, local groups and businesses, make decisions on local services, colaborate with district and borough councils to adhere to local needs and progress vital projects to invest in the future of the community.

CAN I STAND FOR ELECTION?

To stand for election to a local council you must be:

- A UK or Commonwealth citizen, or be a citizen of the Republic of Ireland, or be a citizen of another Member State of the European Union.
- At least 18 years old.
- An elector of the local council, or in the last twelve months occupied land or other premises in the area the local council serves (as your principal or only place of work) or live within three miles of the local council boundary.

COMMUNITY UPDATE

We have made combating scams one of our divisional priorities. We have seen an increase in this type of crime being reported in January 2023. CID are investigating crimes where offenders have rung victims claiming to be police officers. The offenders then ask the victims to transfer money from their bank account, purchase items online or withdraw cash from bank accounts and bureaux de change. The fraudster will later attend the victims home address and collect the cash, this is sometimes referred to as a courier scam. Please remember YOUR BANK OR THE POLICE WILL NEVER......

- 1) Phone and ask for your PIN or banking password, even by tapping them into your phone keypad.
- 2) Ask you to withdraw money.
- Ask you to transfer money to a new or other account for fraud reasons, even if they say it is in your name.
- Send someone to your home to collect cash, PIN, cards or cheque books if they say you have been a victim of fraud.
- 5) Ask you to purchase goods using your card and then hand them over for safe keeping.

Your neighbourhood policing team will be conducting neighbourhood surgeries over the coming weeks to give advice about how to detect these scams and how to safeguard yourself. If you see us around, please stop us for a chat. Our surgeries will be advertised on social media, in our newsletters and by using our advertising van.

Your local Neighbourhood Policing Team appreciates the importance of being in the right place, at the right time, for the right reasons to reassure the public, improve public confidence and reduce crime and anti-social behaviour in the area in which we all live and work.

We encourage all residents to call and report any issues where they live so that we can deal with any issues and step up our patrols in the area.

If you feel that there are other issues affecting you or your local community that should be given priority, please inform your local Neighbourhood Policing Team.

ASB

On 03/02/23 we were called to a report of a person causing a disturbance in Sibsey. We attended and a female was arrested for being drunk and disorderly in a public place and spent the night in custody. We will not tolerate anti-social behaviour in our communities

Traffic Offence

On 11/01/23 Our patrols stopped a car in the Spilsby area. Inquiries revealed that the driver had no Insurance. The car was seized, and the driver will be prosecuted.

On 27/01/23 one of our patrols arrested the driver of a car in the Spilsby area after they failed a roadside drugs test and were found to have no insurance.

Rural Crime Action Team

Our commitment to protect rural communities and tackle crimes including hare coursing, lead thefts and fly-tipping has been realised and enhanced with the formation of a new rural crime action team.

The team of eight police constables and one sergeant will be employed by Lincolnshire Police in the coming months as part of our recruitment uplift.

They will target rural crime such as hare coursing and wildlife crime, arson, flytipping, lead theft, theft from farms and rural properties as well as offer crime prevention advice.

Op Signature

This is a special ongoing operation which identifies and helps vulnerable people who may have been or could be a victim of scam / banking fraud. Some reports are passed to police via Action Fraud, who may have taken the initial report.

This will result in a member of the neighbourhood policing team making a face to face visit to the victim. Fuller details of the crime are obtained, with further safeguarding measures put in place. These could include; a telephone call blocker, 'No Cold Calling' signs, scam awareness packs, alert relative/ friends.

Since the last edition of the Spilsby Explorer, a great bit of good news is that East Lindsey District Council were successful in their bid to the Levelling Up fund. The fund seeks to support projects that have the potential to improve lives and give people pride in their communities. The Sessions House is a listed building and a significant part of Spilsby's history. It will be supported to bring the building back into use as a theatre and as a community-owned space. The funding would allow the building's old police cells to be opened to the public, creating a new visitor attraction.

Since my election in May 2019, I have championed investment and revival of the Sessions House. The credit goes to Bruce Knight and the team at the Sessions House, working in partnership with East Lindsey District Council, to make this bid a success. Congratulations on the success of the bid. I believe that the Sessions House will become a valuable community asset as well as a powerhouse for Culture, Arts and Entrainment within the East Lindsey District.

Spilsby is fortunate in having a beautiful Town centre, a Heritage area. When I walked round the area with the Heritage Manager a few months ago, we felt that there were some areas at risk. A specially commissioned report for Spilsby should be available soon and this should provide guidance on how to improve the area.

For the first time, residents in East Lindsey will need to **show photographic ID to vote** at this year's local elections on 04 May 2023. This is required by the UK Government Election Act. Accepted forms of ID include a UK, European Economic Area (EEA) or Commonwealth passport; a UK. EEA or Commonwealth drivers' licence: and some concessionary travel passes, such as an older person's bus pass or an Oyster 60+ card. Voters will be able to use expired ID if they are still recognisable from the photo. Residents who do not have one of the accepted forms of ID can apply for free ID either www.voter-authority-certificate. at service.gov.uk/ or by completing a paper application form and sending this to East Lindsey District Council's electoral services team. If you need any help with applying for the free ID or want to request an application form, contact the electoral services team on 01507 601111.

Anyone who wants to have their say in the elections this May must also be registered to vote. It only takes five minutes to register online at www.gov.uk/ register-to-vote. Voters wishing to apply to their council for free ID should first make sure they are registered to vote. If you are unable to vote in person at your local polling station you can vote by post or by nominating a proxy. Applications for these methods of voting must be received in good time by East Lindsey District Council. Further details can be found at: https://www.e-lindsey.gov.uk/ article/5887/How-to-Register

The newly introduced waste and recycling collection system has been around for a few weeks now. Please remember that crisp tubes or greasy takeaway pizza boxes cannot be recycled in the purplelidded bin (paper and card) or grey bin (recycling), as they are contaminated with grease. These will need to go in the black (general waste) bin please. The cost-of-living crisis continues to hurt. The Household Support Fund has been launched in South and East Lincolnshire. Funds of up to £300 will be paid to individuals and families in East Lindsey, who have not received any cost-of-living support. Funding originates from UK Government via the South and East Lincolnshire Councils

Partnership's Household Support Scheme. Applications can be made at www.lincolnshirecf.co.uk from 1st February 2023 until 24th March 2023. If you do not have access to the website, please contact the Grants team on 01529 305825 or email katie@lincolnshirecf. co.uk.

HOW IS THE TOWN'S FIRE STATION AND CREW PERFORMING?

Calls for the station have returned to normal levels following the unprecedented hot weather in July and August, 2022 and then the subsequent wet weather that saw floods in Market Rasen, Louth and Spalding. However, this hasn't meant that the crew haven't faced challenging incidents in this time. Particular incidents of note are the serious fire at Dorothy Avenue in Skegness that, due to other calls being received for incidents in Skegness, meant that Spilsby was the first appliance in attendance. Also the recent Silt Side building on London Road in Boston which resulted in the road being closed and the building demolished a few days later.

The station has performed well in its recent station audit, receiving an overall score of 92.7%

So how many incidents has the crew attended between 21st October 2022 and 21st January 2023?

 They responded to the following number of call outs

 21st – 31st October – 5 calls (10 for the whole month)

 December – 15 calls

 November – 13 calls

- CARE AS INDIVIDUAL AS YOU ARE -

Winter 2022-2023 has been the busiest ever for Spilsby Surgery and for General Practice in England. The predicted 'twindemic' of influenza and a further wave of Covid, combined with RSV (respiratory syncytial virus) in kids and GAS (group A strep) panic led to our care navigators and duty clinicians dealing with at times 140 unscheduled contacts a day. Face masks and face coverings in the practice remain an essential dress code for the protection of staff and patients. My mask helps protect you, and your mask protects others.

Spilsby Surgery's reputation in the Lincolnshire health system is such that our patients currently benefit from a fully staffed nursing and GP team. However, we don't need to look far afield to see previously stable surgery teams face sudden and serious staffing difficulties. In England there are nearly 2000 fewer fully trained full-time GPs than in 2015 (losing 400 in the last year alone). Lincolnshire has one of the lowest numbers of GPs per head of population in the country. Despite a big investment in training new GPs and recruiting international doctors, the county has haemorrhaged experienced doctors at an equal rate.



Last year, GP practices in England delivered 329 million appointments – 17 million more than in the year before the pandemic, yet the Government and NHS England continue to tell us and the public that we're not working hard enough. Instead of investing in safe quality care, they are further harming the morale, resilience and health of primary care teams.

The effects of recent inflation will be felt by families and businesses – the Surgery is a small business – for years to come, with rocketing expenses and bills. A welcome rise in the National Living Wage requires salaries to be uprated across our whole team (care navigators, secretaries, nurses), with no additional funding from Government.

The GP partnership model of general practice – small businesses embedded in, investing for, and accountable to the communities they serve – is under increasing threat. You risk a workforce salaried to large international healthcare companies who may well put shareholder dividends first.

It looks unlikely that GP leaders and the main political parties will agree on the urgent need to invest more in health care close to your home, and that we will seek the same support from our patients that you have recently given to hospital nurses and ambulance staff. Extra hospital beds or shiny ambulances won't keep the NHS afloat if there are fewer dedicated but undervalued staff to care for you.

PREMISES UPDATE

Once again, our developers report a delay in breaking ground on the Halton Road site earmarked for the new surgery build. The contractor for the surrounding housing development wishes to progress agreements with the District Council before releasing the plot and access to our builders. Two Portakabin consulting rooms will be in operation at our Simpson Street site from mid-March to make do until (we hope) mid-2024.



At the Town Council Precept meeting on Thursday 19th January, 2023 £50,000.00 was allocated in the budget of 2023/24 for this project.

We have met with various Play equipment suppliers on site and intend to bring the area up to date with wet pour surfacing and equipment to suit children of all ages (0-12years). We also aim to provide accessible and inclusive play equipment, more seating areas and picnic tables.

This project will most likely be carried out in stages over the next two to three years. Phase 1 will be focused on a central point (Explorer's Ship) aimed at 0-12 years with suitable access from the main gate. Phases 2 and beyond will feature key pieces being replaced.
